

1. Privacy Policy

Antique Arms & Militaria Exhibitions (AA&ME) treats the privacy of our exhibitors very seriously and complies with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR). This policy describes how we protect and manage any personal data* you share with us and that we hold about you, including how we collect, process and share that data.

* Personal data we hold means any information that may be used to identify an individual, including but not limited to:

- a) Personal details such as your full name and your company name (if applicable)
- b) Contact details such as your postal address, telephone number, mobile number, e-mail address
- c) Additional information such as short description about kind of militaria items you usually have on sale or specialise in

1.1 How we obtain your personal data

You provide us with all your personal data and contact details in letters and e-mails, verbally in person and over the telephone or electronically by using our website, particularly the registration form to our “Exhibitor’s Waiting List”. The rest of the personal data is recorded by us as we provide our service to you.

1.2 How we use your personal data

We need to keep accurate personal data about you in order to provide our service to you. This the legal basis of our holding your personal data.

1.3 Usage of the data for marketing purposes

Your details will not be passed onto any third parties for marketing purposes. However if you registered on our “Exhibitor’s Waiting List” we may contact you from time to time (usually about 1 month before each of our events) with AA&ME marketing offers such us information about stalls availability. You may opt out at any time.

2. How we process the data

We process the personal data we hold about you in the following way.

2.1 Retaining the information

We retain your personal information no longer than two years since your last authorisation. After this time records are shredded and disposed of and computer files are deleted. We can receive your authorisation in a form of an e-mail, a signed letter or signed booking form. Completing and submitting our on-line registration form for our “Exhibitor’s Waiting List” is also tread as your authorisation.

2.2 Security of current and archived information

Personal data about you is held in the company computer system and in our current or archive manual filing system. The information is not accessible to the public and only authorised members of staff have access to it. Our computer system is protected has secure audit trails and we back up information routinely.

2.3 Disclosure of information

We may disclose some of your personal details to individuals who looking to contact you about the matter related to your business. This is possible only if that individual is able to identify you by your name or the location of the stall you held on a specific event of ours. In such case we only disclose contact details such as: your first name, your surname, your telephone number, your mobile number, your e-mail address. You may opt out at any time.

We do not transfer your data outside the European Economic Area (EEA).

When required by law or a court order, personal data may have to be disclosed to a third party not connected with our business. In all other situations, disclosure that is not covered by this Privacy Policy will only occur when we have you’re your specific consent.

3. Data subject rights

3.1 Subject access requests

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) grants you, 'the data subject' the right to access particular personal data that we hold about you. This is referred to as a subject access request. Access may be obtained by making a request in writing. We will provide a copy of the record within 21 days of the receipt of the request and an explanation of your record should you require it.

3.2 Right to rectification

You, 'the data subject' shall have the right to obtain from us, without undue delay, the rectification of inaccurate personal data we hold concerning you. Taking into account the purpose of the processing, you, 'the data subject' shall have the right to have incomplete personal data completed.

3.3 Right to restriction of processing

Subject to exemptions, you, 'the data subject' shall have the right to obtain from us restriction of processing where one of the following applies:

- a) the accuracy of the personal data is contested by you, and is restricted until accuracy has been verified;
- b) the processing is unlawful and you oppose the erasure of the personal data and instead request the restriction of its use;
- c) we no longer need the personal data for the purposes of processing, but it is required by you for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims;
- d) you have objected to the processing of your personal data pending the verification of whether there are legitimate grounds for us to override these objections.

3.4 Right to data portability

You have the right to receive your personal data, which you have provided to us, in a structured, commonly used and machine readable format.

3.5 Right to object

You have the right to object about the processing of personal data concerning you unless this relates to processing that is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or an exercise of official authority vested in us. We shall no longer process the personal data unless we can demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for the processing, which override your interests, rights and freedom or the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.

3.6 Right to not be subject to decisions basely solely on automated processing

We do not carry out any automated processing, which may lead to an automated decision based on your personal data.

3.7 Invoking your rights
